



OVERALL ANALYSIS

After going through the aforementioned analysis and the above remarks it is observed that students want improvement of the following:

1/ COMPLETION OF SYLLABUS: Most of the students feel that syllabus is not 100% complete; rather the extent of the completion is 70 - 80 % only

2/ LIBRARY: Though there is a remark by student to enrich the library with more number of titles; but the analysis to the question no.2 of the above table shows that \$4.71 % of students feel that library material and facilities are adequate. Therefore despite of the contradiction, scope for improvement of library by acquiring more titles and entering better services to students is unavoidable.

3/METHOD OF TEACHING: Students feel that teacher's encouraging students to participate in class is less than 50% which indicates a passive classroom atmosphere.

4/ HELP OF TEACHER: It seems students do endorse that teachers are helpful in the college

5/ INTERNAL ASSESSMENT: It seems only 71% of students are of the opinion that assessment is fair; thus, still there is 30% scope for improvement

6/TEACHERS FEEDBACK TO STUDENTS: encouraging.

7/ SPORTS FACILITY: should be improved.(vide students suggestion no. d) 8/ PUNCTUALITY: faculty must adhere to the time according to the class routine. And classes should be taken

as par routine irrespective of number of students present for that class. (vide students suggestion to b & e) 9/EXTRA CLASSES: Some remedial type of coaching must be initiated to cater students who for any reason
