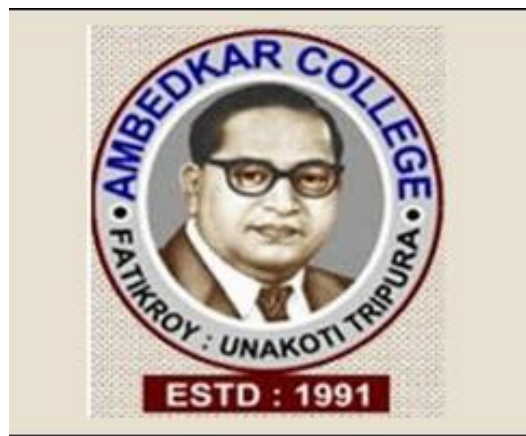

Ambedkar College, a Government General Degree College (GDC), was established on 26<sup>th</sup> September 1991. Initially the college was running in the campus of Fatikroy Class XII School, as it had no campus of its own. Afterwards on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1999 the college got its present permanent campus, which was acquired at the cost of vacating 34 families residing in that area who were rehabilitated by the local administration in Govt. land within 1 KM from the college. The college is located in the Laldahar area, under Rajnagar GP of Fatikroy, Kumarghat subdivision, Unakoti (24.1716229 0N 92.01599310E) Tripura. Since the initial days, this college marked with the sacrifice of common people of this land and through years of struggles from various fronts, this college has grown to its present form, which comprises of 10.4 Acres of land encompassing an old and a new campus along with a number of academicians with impressive numbers of students. The college is permanently affiliated to the Tripura University (A Central University) since 2009. And in the year 2010 the college got UGC recognition under the section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. In course of its glorious journey of over 32 years, the College has achieved to run **sixteen departments, Learner Support Centre of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)** to help the working man and woman of this rural area to fulfill their aspiration for higher learning. The College also has **NIELIT centre** to offer short term courses on computer literacy. College offers three years/ four years (Six Semesters/ Eight Semesters) UG degree programs, i.e. B. A., B.Sc. and B.Com in different subjects in Credit Based Semester System/ Choice Based Credit System under NEP-2020. The college is the **first Govt. Degree College of Tripura**

**participated in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, ranking in 2017-18 and also participated in succeeding years.**

As an academic institution for Higher Education based in a rural area, the college has always tried to improve the quality of education. As part of that and following the mandate of UGC, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was established in the college in the year 2012 and has been functioning as a catalyst for many processes about quality nourishment and enhancement. Subsequently, ignoring all constraints and with the only aim to improve the quality of education, the college went through the first cycle accreditation by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), an autonomous institution of UGC, Govt. of India, in the year 2015 and obtained C grade with CGPA 1.52. And in the year 2021, converting the challenges of Covid-19 pandemic into opportunities, college faced the second cycle accreditation was done by **NAAC and secured B+ grade with CGPA 2.69, in second cycle.**

The college was established on **26<sup>th</sup> September 1991**. Initially the college was running in the campus of Fatikroy Class XII School, afterwards on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1999 the college got its present permanent campus, which was acquired at the cost of vacating thirty-four families residing in that area who were being rehabilitated by the local administration in Govt. land within 1 KM from the college. Since the initial days of this college marked with the sacrifice of common men of this land and through years of struggles from various fronts, this college has grown to its present form, which comprises of 11.3 acre encompassing an old and a new campus and a sizable number of academicians along with impressive numbers of students. The college is permanently affiliated to the Tripura University (A Central University) and is recognized by University Grant Commission (UGC) under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) since 2010. In 2015, the college was accredited by NAAC, Bangalore.

The college offers three years/ four years (**Six Semesters – 2+2+2/ Eight Semesters - 2+2+2+2**) **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)**, Undergraduate (UG) programs, i.e. Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) Honours/ Major and General/ Minor courses in following subjects, viz. Bengali, Education, Economics, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Sanskrit, Kokborok and Bachelor of Science (B. Sc.) Honours/ Major and General/ Minor courses in Physical Science with Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and B.Sc (BioSc) in Zoology Botany and Human Physiology. Also Major and Minor course in Commerce. Apart from these, there are many interdisciplinary courses, Value Added Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses in our College.

The college has a well-equipped computer lab, Digital Language lab, wi-fi enabled E-Study Centre and Smart class rooms. Many of the class rooms are well equipped with modern and sophisticated Electronic Teaching Aid. The college has a Gymnasium with latest equipment, a badminton court and other sports facilities are available for the students and staff. For performing cultural programme and holding seminar etc. a 300 seated auditorium is available in the college. The Campus is being monitored by CC camera.

In spite of communication problems and difficulties we never turned ourselves away from our goal that is to make the students cultured, fearless, expressive and self-reliant.

Hope with the sincerity, honesty and transparency of the administration, co-operation of parents, students and the able guidance of the teaching fraternity this college will touch a new height in sphere of Higher Education in the state of Tripura.

## **Chapter-11: Green Audit:**

Numerous environmental and ecological crises have been brought on by the fast urbanization and economic growth at the local, regional, and worldwide levels. Ambedkar College, Fatikroy is extremely concerned and firmly feels that in order to resist the trend, these core problems must be addressed immediately. The audit's goal was to confirm that campus procedures adhered to the environmental policy. It focuses on several aspects of a "Green Campus," such as waste management, water conservation, tree planting, paperless work, alternative energy, etc. In light of this, the audit's specific goal was to assess the institute's compliance with relevant laws, rules, and standards, as well as the suitability of its management control system for environmental sustainability.

Considering that the college is a general degree college, there are a lot of environmental awareness projects being carried out by the faculty and students. There are a lot of significant environmental awareness programs. The administration's environmental awareness initiatives demonstrate how the campus is going green. A few more suggestions have been made to use scientific and environmentally friendly methods to further reduce the threat of waste management. In the context of Green Campus, this will result in a successful future and, consequently, in the development of sustainable environments and communities.

## **Chapter-12: Alumni Activities:**

The Alumni association of the college started its initiatives long back in the year 2014. The association got registered under Societies Registration Act, Govt. of Tripura in 2019. Since then, the association has extended all possible help to the college for its smooth conduct. The Alumni Association of the college was established with an aim to extend help in the development of the institution and the society at large. The college takes pride in its alumni members as they are important stakeholders of the institution and conscious efforts are made to strengthen the relationship between the institution and the alumni. The Alumni Association meetings are held regularly to discuss their future plans pertaining to any social cause or developmental activities inside the college. The IQAC of the College has the President of the Alumni Association as a representative member. And every year members of the association give their valuable feedback on different areas pertaining to the college collected by IQAC. Besides, the Alumni association contributes through different non-financial form, viz. plantation of trees inside college campus, Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan in association with Teachers' Council and, NSS, NCC, YRC etc. Members of the alumni association regularly visit the college to motivate the students for academic betterment of the college. Many of them are engaged in serving society through various other organizations and means. The Institution has a good affinity with the Alumni and has always looked forward to a meaningful and valuable association. They also purchased one piece of land adjacent to College area from local seller and handed over to College authority.

## **Chapter-13:Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)**

### **Criterion-wise Observations and Suggestions:**

#### **1. Curricular Aspects:**

**Observations:** As the college is affiliated to Tripura University so the syllabus and rules and regulations pertaining to curricular aspects prescribed by the affiliating university is followed by every departments of the college. Every department of the college functions strictly adhering to the academic calendar of the college. Departments have no autonomy to introduce new courses independently. Few teachers of the college are in various BoS.

**Suggestions:** 1. More number teachers should be involved in the different BoS.  
2. Departments should submit proposal for add-on, certificate and diploma to various agencies.

#### **2. Teaching learning and evaluation:**

**Observations:** The teaching day in all departments is above 85%. Department wise teacher- student's ration is very poor; contrary to the overall teacher-students ratio of the college. Over all students' pass percentage in 6<sup>th</sup> Semester is 97%. Overall dropout rate is 56%. In the year 2021-22, 543 students enrolled in 1<sup>st</sup> year but only 305 students appeared in final exam in the academic year 2023-24. At the beginning of the academic session all departments distributes their syllabus among teachers as per allotted classes and maintain the record. Teachers of all departments maintain academic planner/teacher's diary and complete their topics according to the teaching plan suggested in the planner/diary. Most of the departments do not maintain course competition report in regular interval. Use of ICT by the teachers of all departments is encouraging. Every department identify slow and advanced learns in their subjects and maintain record of the same; but did not arrange any formal remedial/special/extra classes for slow and advanced learners. Departments arrange counseling classes for students, but in a informal way without maintaining any record of the same. Regular departmental meetings and parent-teacher meeting are conducted by departments. Student's attendance is maintained by all departments. Average percentage of attendance of students in class is above 75%. And for students having low (bellow average) attendance, personal counseling of students, parent-teacher meeting personally contacting parents, etc. is done as improvement majors. Examination and evaluation is done by every department as per the rules of the affiliating university. This year, as new teaching strategies/innovations/technologies most of the departments have adopted online teaching through Google meet, Skype, Zoom, YouTube for theory classes and Virtual Lab for practical classes along with traditional methods.

Teachers of most of the departments do support students in their learning by providing notes. Record Keeping practice of departments is poor. We are now in the era of NEP-2020, so we should be acquainted with latest syllabus including Indian knowledge system, value added courses and also skill enhancement courses.

- Suggestions:**
1. Teacher-Student ratio in departmental level needs improvement.
  2. Course completion report should be maintained by departments in regular interval to assess the extent of course completion
  3. Formal remedial/special/extra classes for slow and advanced learners.
  4. Formalization of students counseling by keeping record for the same.
  5. Class tests should be conducted by departments as much as possible.
  6. Dropout rate should be minimized.

### **3. Research consultancy and extension:**

**Observations:** There is running one minor research projects in the department of Sanskrit. In this year no national level seminar was organized by any department of the College. Few faculty members published their research papers in the UGC CARE listed journal; a good of teachers have published articles in edited books and published books. Teachers of all departments have attended different webinars/ Seminars/ Workshops during this year.

Besides the extension activities organized by NCC, NSS, YRC etc. at college level and aforementioned webinars organized by departments, it seems that due to restrictions of pandemic situation, only few departments, i.e. Political Science, Botany and Sanskrit, Bengali, Kokborok have organized extension activities for students at departmental level. Dept. of Botany has gone for field study; dept. of Sanskrit has organized creative writing competition, celebrated Sanskrit and Teachers' days; dept. of Bengali has celebrated International Mother Language day; dept. of Kokborok has observed Kokborok day.

- Suggestions:**
1. More departments should submit research project proposal to various R&D agencies.
  2. Number of teaches publishing research works in journals, books etc., and the number of research papers per teacher should increase.
  3. Organizing more extension activities at departmental level is expected.
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#### **4. Infrastructure and learning resources:**

**Observations:** Infrastructure and learning resources in college good to some extent, because the college has library with good number of books and digitized; computer lab; digital language lab; one e-study center; five smart classes rooms, etc. But inadequate classes rooms for arts stream. Separate library building was constructed. Construction of Boundary wall is going on. And evidences of expansion in learning resources at departmental level are not observed.

**Suggestions:** 1. Classrooms for arts stream.

2. Provision for computers with internet and printer in all departments.

3. Departmental library should be fortified with more number of books.

#### **5. Students support and progression:**

**Observations:** Support facilities for students at college level are reasonably good; except an independent play ground for the college as an urgent need. Total 937 students have been benefited from various schemes of state and central government scholarships this year. A good number of skill and capacity building activities, career and counseling activities, etc. were organized in the college. For timely redressal of students' grievances there is a grievance redressal committee. It seems only 9 students have got placement during this year; but the college or the department has no formal mechanism to record the list of students placed during a year. Total 24 students from various departments have opted for higher education that is only 8% of total pass out students. One student of Department of Mathematics has secured 2<sup>nd</sup> rank in university examination this year. No students have qualified all India entrance tests, viz. NET SLET etc. One student of Department of Physics cleared JAM in this year. There is an Alumni Association of the college that has organized one programme during this year; but there is no alumni association in departmental level.

**Suggestions:** 1. Departments should strive hard to produce university rank holders.

2. Play ground for college and sports activities of the college should be regularized.

3. Increase number of capacity building activities, career and counseling activities

4. Proper mechanism for keeping the record of students placed should be formalized through Placement Cell of the college.

5. Students' progression to higher education should be increased by motivating students for HE at departmental level.

6. Every department should have an alumni association.

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## **6. Governance leadership and management:**

**Observations:** Governance, leadership and management at college level is very good. The effect of the same could be seen at the departmental level. HODs of almost all departments are proactive to the quality initiatives of the college administration.

**Suggestions:** Practice of keeping record for each and every activity at department level may bring a positive impact on the data management of the college.

## **7. Innovation and best practices:**

**Observations:** During the process of academic audit some departments have presented that their extracurricular activities, viz. seminar, webinar, workshops, publishing wall magazine etc., and encouraging students to participate therein to bring out the best within students as their best practices. Some other departments have highlighted some practices in teaching learning, viz. use of virtual lab for practical, use of e-books, hands on training in laboratory, class tests, and maintenance of course completion reports etc. as their best practices.

**Suggestions:** 1. Departments must consider on doing something unique beyond the regular teaching learning and extracurricular activities as their best practice.

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### **Strength, Weakness, Opportunities/ Challenges:**

**Strength:** 1. Committed faculty members with commitment to develop quality teaching.

2. ICT enabled infrastructures.

**Weakness:** 1. Less number of class rooms.

2. Inadequate number of teachers in every department.

3. Poor research culture.

**Opportunities:** 1. Enough scope for optimizing the use of ICT in teaching and learning.


2. Enough scope for producing university rank holders.


**Challenges:** 1. Placement for passed out students, and maintaining record for the same.

2. Optimizing the rate of students' progression to higher education.
