#### **INAUGURAL SESSION**

The workshop begins with the inaugural session at 11.00 am on 19<sup>th</sup> of July, 2020, Wednesday, in college auditorium. #### **TECHNICAL SESSION - I**

The first technical session was started after lunch break at 1.00 pm following the inaugural session on 19<sup>th</sup> of February, 2020. This session was chaired by the resource person Dr. Manoj Kumar Paul, principal, Women's College, Silchar and Sri L. T. Muana Darlong, DDO & Head in-charge, Department of Economics, Ambedkar College, did perform he duty of rapporteur. Three classes were planned for this session, but as one of the resource persons Mr. Saju Vaheed A., Director, Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of Tripura could not come, therefore only two classes were taken in this session.

First class was taken by **Dr. Ajoy Kumar Khan,** Associate Professor, Department of Computer Engineering Mizoram University(A Central University), Aizawl. He discussed about the **Role of ICT in Higher Education**, highlighting the needs and tools of ICT to improve the teaching-learning process of higher education institutions.

Second class was taken by **Dr. Ananta Kumar Jena**, Assistant Prof., Dept. Education, Assam University, Silchar. Dr. Jena discuss in details about UNESCO's ICT framework, Implementing MOOCs in teaching and learning, Philosophy of MOODLE, Components of 21st century classroom, Technology supported classroom, Virtual learning environment, Tools of LMS, Tools of assessment etc.

After these two classes there was a brief question answer session, by that participants clarifies their doubts. With this the first technical session and the first day of the two days workshop comes to an end.

#### **TECHNICAL SESSION - II**

On the second day of the workshop, i.e. 20/02/2020, Thursday, the second technical session started at 10:30 A.M. This session was chaired by Dr. Dilip Sarkar, Principal, Govt. Degree College, Dharmanagar. Four classes were taken by four different resource persons.

First class was taken by **Dr. Manoj Kumar Paul**, Principal, Women's College, Silchar. He discussed on the role of RUSA in adopting ICT tools in teaching-learning by providing fund to higher education institutions and put forth the issues and challenges for adopting ICT tools.

Second class was taken by **Dr. Swanirbhar Majumder**, Associate Prof., Dept. of IT, Tripura University. He spoke on presently available various ICT tools for teaching-learning, benefits of online courses and programmes offered by different HEIs, and merits and demerits of those online programmes.

Third class was taken by **Dr. Jena** of Assam University. He at the beginning discussed on Ethics in Content Preparation for Quality Improvement in Higher Education, highlighting creative commons licenses, Plagiarism, Author index and journal index, Impact Factor, How to publish a paper? And in the second part of his class he discussed on Study Webs of Active –Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM) and ICT initiatives of GOVERNMENT OF INDIA.

Fourth class was taken by **Dr. Dilip Sarkar**. He discussed on the role of RUSA in setting up smart classrooms, language labs, automation of office, arranging faculty training programmes etc. as means of adopting ICT in colleges. Also he highlighted the need of autonomy to the college administration for utilizing the RUSA fund and he opined that motivation of teachers is most for making the adaptation of ICT in teaching successful.

After these classes, Lunch Break was there from 1:30 to 2:00 P.M.

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### **TECHNICAL SESSION - III**

Third technical session starts at 2:15 P.M. In this session the representative of ORELL technology from Kerala discussed about setting up of a digital language lab. He highlighted that how a digital language lab could be set up without creating any separate infrastructure, in contrary to the analog language lab, and this lab could be useful for various purposes like developing the soft skill of students, developing and sharing e-contents etc.

This session was presided by the Dr. Subrata Sharma, principal i/c of our college. Therein participants are asked to give their feedback in written format and certificates are distributed to the participants.
