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INTRODUTION

It gives me immense pleasure to publish the Annual Report of Ambedkar College for the academic year 2018-19.

Ambedkar College was established on 26th September 1991. Initially the college was running in the campus of Fatikroy Class XII School, afterwards on 15th August 1999 the college got its present permanent campus, which was acquired at the cost of vacating thirty-four families residing in that area who were being rehabilitated by the local administration in Govt. land within 1 KM from the college. Since the initial days of this college marked with the sacrifice of common men of this land and through years of struggles from various fronts, this college has grown to its present form, which comprises of 11.3 acre encompassing an old and a new campus and a sizable number of academicians along with impressive numbers of students.

Ambedkar College has committed vision to instill a very high sense of dedication and discipline in the mind of students and to ensure a global standard of education by imparting quality education. It has the vision to make the learners intellectually superior and ethically strong. The Institution also affixes its goal to ascertain the unity and integrity among the people of different communities and religions and to uplift the weaker section of the region. The institution also takes upon itself the arduous responsibility to identify the potentials, possibilities, as well as weakness in the teaching and learning process with a view to elevating the institution to the level of excellence and also to the national development. Keeping in mind the aspirant educational zeal of the vast masses of the great catchment area, the progress of which is centered on the development of this seat of higher learning, the Ambedkar College since its inception is growing day by day and imparting education to the youths of the rural area. And especially in past few years the progress has gain momentum which has been resulted into different developmental activities, viz. new academic and administrative buildings, ongoing work of the construction of auditorium etc.

The college is the first Govt. Degree college of Tripura to participate in the NIRF ranking in the year 2017-18 and also please to inform that the college is also among a few colleges in Tripura accreditation by NAAC on the 1st May 2015. Ambedkar College has completed twentynine years of its academic excellence this year. It is a General Degree College functioning under the Department of Education (Higher), Govt. of Tripura. It is permanently affiliated to the Tripura University (A Central University) and is recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) since 2010. Under graduate teaching and research carried out on the beautiful campus, spread over 11.3 acre encompassing an old and a new campus. There are 11 departments and 1 center for Distance Education of Tripura University. From 2014 onwards, the college offers three years (Six Semesters – 2+2+2) Under Graduate (UG) programs, i.e. Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) Honours and General and Bachelor of Science (B. Sc.) General, in different subjects, viz. Bengali, Education, Economics, English, History, Kokborok, Political Science, Philosophy, Sanskrit, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics, in Choice based Credit System (CBCS).

The college has a well-equipped computer lab to provide the knowledge of ICT to the students. Some of the class rooms are equipped with Smart Class Room facility as sponsored by UGC and NMEICT, Govt. of India. Old campus is being monitored by CC camera. All the class rooms are well equipped with modern and sophisticated Electronic Teaching Aid. Science lab (Physics and Chemistry Lab) has been set up in the new academic building. One well equipped Language lab has been set up for spoken English and Spoken Sanskrit. Both the campuses are Wi-Fi enabled. The college provides reprographic facility for student in an affordable rate. Inflibnet has been subscribed by the college library to enhance the research activity of teachers. The college takes initiative for library Automation. This College runs a center for Distance Education of Tripura University to help the working man and woman of this rural area to fulfill their aspiration for higher learning. Proposal for opening of a study Centre of IGNOU has

already been sent to Regional Centre. Proposal to start NCC Boys Unit is already approved by

DHE.

Besides the above mentioned planned curriculum the college authority always takes efforts

for the all-round progress and development of students. The aim is not just to impart knowledge

to the students but also to inculcate in them-wisdom, compassion, humanism, skills, attitude,

knowledge and values that will allow them to participate and contribute positively in an ever

changing world. The college has a Career Counseling cell which helps and guides students for

their future career. The College recently proposed to NEILEIT Agartala to offer one short term

course on computer literacy and spoken English (free of cost) for the students. The college

always continuously organize seminar/ workshop/training programme to make their students

morally sound and to aware on different current issues of society. The NSS unit always

motivates students to serve for the common people of the society. The unit regularly organizes

awareness campaign, blood donation and health checkup etc.

- 1. A Lecture Program On the "Various Career Scope In Indian Army", On 31st July 2018, Organised by Career and Counseling Cell

2. Two-Day National Seminar on "Tribals Of Tripura In Transition: A Socio- Economic and Political Perspective", on 23rd 24th August 2018, Organized by Department of Political Science

Two-Day National Seminar on "Tribals of Tripura in Transition: A Socio- Economic and Political Perspective" was held on 23rd& 24th August 2018. The seminar was started well in advance and the beginning was with reception by presenting flower bouquet to the guests and soon after with lighting the holy lamp by inaugurator followed by National Anthem by the students and teachers and after that inaugural song sung by the students of the College. The seminar had 4(four) session including valedictory session.

Inagural session was held on 23rd August 2018 from 10:30 AM. The session was presided over by Dr. Subrata Sharma, Principal in-charge, Ambedkar College, Fatikroy. Sri ArunodoySaha, formar Vice-chancellor of Tripura University was the chief guest and the inaugurator of the Seminar.

Welcome address was delivered by Mr. Satyajit Das, Organizing Secretary of the Seminar and Assistant Professor, dept. of Political Science, Ambedkar College, Fatikroy. He highlighted the transition of the tribes of Tripura. Key note address was delivered by Prof. Dr. ArunodoySaha, formar Vice-chancellor of Tripura University. His discussion was based on world perspectives. He inspired the participants and encourage them for closely associating with the research activities such as collaborating with other state, other countries, interchange of intellectuals etc.

Next speaker was Sri Bhogoban Das, MLA Kumarghat constituency. His point was on the status of tribals in Tripura since last fifty years. He mentioned the history of tribal people of Tripura including their sufferings, their aspirations, and their present transformation.

The fourth speaker was Sri. Dingliana Darlong, DM, Unakoti Tripura. He emphasized on Tribal Development in Tripura, specially focused on the educational status of tribals in Tripura. For him education is a factor which can change their present status infact their status has undergoing changes through the effect of education. He explained it and share his own experiences.

The fifth speaker was Sri Amrit Kr. Bhattacharjee, ex-Principal in-charge of Ambedkar College, Fatikroy. He pointed out the present scenario of the state and explores the status of marginalized tribals of Tripura.

The sixth speaker was Sri Sunil ch. Das, ex Minister, Govt. of Tripura, said about the growth of tribal education in Tripura and about changing factor that works for the tribal community of the state.

The last but not the least speaker was the president of inaugural session, Dr. Subrata Sharma, Principal in-charge, Ambedkar College, Fatikroy. He emphasized on tribal condition of Tripura. He ended his speech by hoping a grand success of this Two-Day National Seminar.

The inaugural session was ended with vote of Thanks by Mr. Lalthlamuana Darlong, Assistant Professor, Department of Economics, Ambedkar College, Fatikroy.







3. Two Days Disaster Response Training, on 12th September 2018 to 13th September 218

The programme starts with the inaugural function presided by Dr. Subrata Sharma, Principal i/c of the college, in presence of Mr. Sudhangshu Das, Honorable M. L. A., Fatikroy, as inaugurator and Mr. Lalhiminga Darlong, D. I. G. Northern Range, Tripura, as chief guest & resource person, Mr. Sandipan Debroy, Lawyer, Kailashahar, and other distinguished guests from media house, teachers and students of the college. The function starts with customary lightening of holy lamp and inaugural song by students of the college. Followed by was the welcome address by Dr. Anil Kr. Acharya, co-coordinator IQAC, speech of the chief guest and speech of inaugurator, respectively.

The chief guest in his speech highlighted the present scenario of the SC & ST Act in Tripura in general and specially in Northern range. Also he elaborate of the role of police as the enforcement agency for protection of civil right and SC & ST acts. He sensitized the students regarding the use and misuse of both the acts, especially the SC & ST act.

The inaugurator, at the outset of his speech, enquired the number of SC and ST students present in the meeting and expressed his satisfaction. He highlighted the need of these two acts and Govt.'s keenness in implementation of these acts in its true spirit. Also asked the students to be aware about their rights and duties pertaining to all fields to make their life successful.

The principal i/c of the college narrates lucidly the basics of these two laws, especially highlighting the recent past of the SC & ST act. And asked the students to be sensitive towards these acts. He concludes his speech by expressing thanks to all the dignitaries, teachers and students of the college.

The inaugural function comes to an end with the aforementioned presidential address.

The second part of this programme was a Technical Session, planned speeches by resource persons. It starts with the speech of Mr. Sandipan Debroy, Lawyer, Kailashahar. He explained the pros and cons of both the acts citing examples from Andhrapradesh and other states of India.

Also highlighted isolated incidences of Tripura pertaining to these two acts. Highlighting the strictness of the SC & ST act he specially mentioned about the no availability of advantages of the Provision of Offender Act, and anticipatory bail.

Mr. Tapas Bhowmik, resource person, highlighted various provisions of the Indian constitution for the protection of civil rights, SC and STs with the initial stress on the ill effects of the so-called 'Hindu Social Order'. He concluded with the remark that only laws are not enough to improve the status of SCs and STs; rather it is the mindset of the people and society that need to be sensitized.

Mr. Biplab Majumder, resource person, in his speech narrates a story of an African farmer and with that sensitized the students about the importance of the self awareness regarding their duties and rights framed for their benefit.

After the speeches of the aforementioned three resource persons the awareness programe comes to an end. And refreshment was served to the present students, teachers and resource persons.

2. Administrative

- Computerisation: The computer lab has been used continuously for Training of both Teaching,
 Non-Teaching and Student's and increased number of seats to accommodate more students at a time.
- Conduct of Examinations: In view of the introduction of Six Semester Choice Based Credit

 System a new exam pattern was introduced, in which two internals become compulsory prerequisite for students to seat in the final examination. It was necessary to put forth an internal effective mechanism with supportive infrastructure for the smooth conduct of examinations including internals. Therefore, in the last two year a separate examination section, which was earlier within the academic section, has been setup with basic infrastructures like computer, printer etc.
- Infrastructural Development: No remarkable developmental has been made during 2018-19 as we did not receive fund for the purpose. However, construction of one Canteen building and a Gymnasium building completed had handed over by PWD during 2018-19 Financial Year. The total fund utilised for the purpose is Rs. 31,06,392/-.

The internal connecting road from administrative building to new Academic building has also been constructed with CC during 2018-19.

• Initiatives to improve the college: The college authority has initiated to pursue for acquiring land of play ground which is utmost important for the students as well as for conducting yearly annual sport of the college. The authority also sends a proposal to SDM, Kumarghat for evacuating and rehabilitation of eight (8) numbers of families who are staying within college campus. A 50 beded ST Hostel will be constructed in this place. Proposal has already been approved by competent authority. To improve academic atmosphere of the college the authority frequently sit with the members of IQAC, and analyse result of previous exam and also taken various steps for regular attendance of the students.
