**Principal/Principal i/c:** Dr. Subrata Sharma, Assistant Professor in Philosophy Ambedkar College, a Government General Degree College (GDC), was established on 26<sup>th</sup> September 1991.Initially the college was running in the campus of Fatikroy Class XII School, as it had no campus of its own. Afterwards on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1999 the college got its present permanent campus, which was acquired at the cost of vacating 34 families residing in that area who were rehabilitated by the local administration in Govt. land within 1 KM from the college. The college is located in the Laldahar area, under Rajnagar GP of Fatikroy, Kumarghat subdivision, Unakoti (24.1716229 0N 92.01599310E) Tripura. Since the initial days, this college marked with the sacrifice of common people of this land and through years of struggles from various fronts, this college has grown to its present form, which comprises of 10.4 Acres



of land encompassing an old and a new campus along with a number of academicians with impressive numbers of students. The college is permanently affiliated to the Tripura University (A Central University) since 2009. And in the year 2010 the college got UGC recognition under the section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956.

In course of its glorious journey of over 29 years, the College has achieved to run fifteen

departments, one centre for Distance Education of Tripura University and Learner Support Centre of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) to help the working man and woman of this rural area to fulfil their aspiration for higher learning. The College also has **NIELIT centre** to offer short term courses on computer literacy. College offers three years (Six Semesters) UG degree programs, i.e. B. A. and B.Sc., in different subjects in Credit Based Semester System. The college is the first **Govt. Degree College of Tripura participated in the National Institutional Ranking Framework** 



(NIRF), Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, ranking in 2017-18 and also participated in succeeding years.

As an academic institution for Higher Education based in a rural area, the college has always tried to improve the quality of education. As part of that and following the mandate of UGC, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was established in the college in the year 2012 and has been functioning as a catalyst for many processes about quality nourishment and enhancement. Subsequently, ignoring all constraints and with the only aim to improve the quality of education, the college went through the first cycle accreditation by National Hard the Assessment and Accreditation Council(NAAC), an autonomous institution of UGC, Govt. of the content of India, in the year 2015 and obtained C grade with CGPA 1.52. 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### 7. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

#### **Criterion-wise Observations and Suggestions:**

#### 1. Curricular Aspects:

**Observations**: As the college is affiliated to Tripura University so the syllabus and rules and regulations pertaining to curricular aspects prescribed by the affiliating university is followed by every departments of the college. Every department of the college functions strictly adhering to the academic calendar of the college. Departments have no autonomy to introduce new courses independently. Few teachers of the college are in various BoS.

Suggestions: 1. More number teachers should be involved in the different BoS.2. Departments should submit proposal for add-on, certificate and diploma to various agencies.

3. Feedback on Curriculum should be taken form Alumni and Parents.

#### 2. Teaching learning and evaluation:

**Observations:** The teaching day in all departments is above 85%. Department wise teacherstudents ration is very poor; contrary to the overall teacher-students ratio of the college. Over all students' pass percentage is 96%. Overall dropout rate is 20%. At the beginning of the academic session all departments distributes their syllabus among teachers as per allotted classes and maintain the record. Teachers of all departments maintain academic planner/teacher's diary and complete their topics according to the teaching plan suggested in the planner/diary. Most of the departments do not maintain course competition report in regular interval. Use of ICT by the teachers of all departments is encouraging. Every department identify slow and advanced learns in their subjects and maintain record of the same; but did not arrange any formal remedial/special/extra classes for slow and advanced learners. Departments arrange counseling classes for students, but in a informal way without maintaining any record of the same. Regular departmental meetings and parent-teacher meeting are conducted by departments. Student's attendance is maintained by all departments. Average percentage of attendance of students in class is above 75%. And for students having low (bellow average) attendance, personal counseling of students, parent-teacher meeting, personally contacting parents, etc. are done as improvement majors. Examination and evaluation is done by every department as per the rules of the affiliating university. This year, due to covid-19 ICT tools were use for conducting internal examinations. Evidence of class tests in all most all departments is nil; except one department. This year, as new teaching strategies/innovations/technologies most of the departments have adopted online teaching through Google meet, Skype, Zoom, YouTube for theory classes and Virtual Lab for practical classes. Teachers of most of the departments do support students in their learning by providing notes. Record keeping practice of departments is poor.

Suggestions: 1. Teacher-Student ration in departmental level need improvement.

2. Course completion report should be maintained by departments in regular interval to assess the extent of course completion

3. Formal remedial/special/extra classes for slow and advanced learners.

4. Formalization of students counseling by keeping record for the same.

5. Classes tests should be conducted by departments as much as possible.

6. Dropout rate should be minimized.

#### 3. Research consultancy and extension:

**Observations:** Only one department, i.e. Human physiology, has attempted for publication out of the work done within the department. There is no running major or minor research projects in the departments. Only two departments, i.e. Economics and Sanskrit, have submitted proposals for project, seminars etc. to funding agencies. Five departments, i.e. Chemistry, Human physiology, History, English and Bengali have organized webinars on different topics. One teacher has publication in the UGC CARE listed journal; two teachers have published two books; three teachers have published four articles in edited books. Teachers of all departments have attended different webinars during this year.

Besides the extension activities organized by NCC, NSS, YRC etc. at college level and aforementioned webinars organized by departments, it seems that due to restrictions of pandemic situation, only few departments, i.e. Political Science, Botany and Sanskrit, Bengali, Kokborok have organized extension activities for students at departmental level. Dept. of Botany has gone for field study; Pol. Sc. dept. has organized online quiz and speech competitions; dept. of Sanskrit has organized creative writing competition, celebrated Sanskrit and Teachers' days; dept. of Benagali has celebrated Internatinal Mother Language day; dept. of Kokborak has observed Kokborok day.

**Suggestions:** 1. More departments should submit research project proposal to various R&D agencies.

2. Number of teaches publishing research works in journals, books etc., and the number of research papers per teacher should increase.

3. Organizing more extension activities at departmental level is expected.

#### 4. Infrastructure and learning resources:

**Observations:** Infrastructure and learning resources in college good to some extent, because the college has library with good number of books and digitized; computer lab; digital language lab; one e-study center; five smart classes rooms, etc. But inadequate classes rooms for arts stream. And evidences of expansion in learning resources at departmental level are not observed. **Suggestions:** 1. Classrooms for arts stream.

2. Provision for computers with internet and printer in all departments.

3. Departmental library should be fortified with more number of books.

#### 5. Students support and progression:

**Observations:** Support facilities for students at college level are reasonably good; except an independent play ground for the college as an urgent need. Total 577 students have been benefited from various schemes of state and central government scholarships this year. Less number of skill and capacity building activities, career and counseling activities, etc. were organized in the college. For timely redressal of students' grievances there is a grievance redressal committee. It seems only 3 students have got placement during this year; but the college or the department has no formal mechanism to record the list of students placed during a year. Total 33 students from various departments (Bengali - 12, Sanskrit - 8, English - 3, Education - 2, Political science - 6 and History - 2) have opted for higher education, that is only 11% of total pass out students. No students have secured any rank in university

examination this year. No students have qualified all India entrance tests, viz. NET SLET etc. There is an Alumni Association of the college that has organized one programme during this year; but there is no alumni association in departmental level.

Suggestions: 1. Departments should strive hard to produce university rank holders.

2. Play ground for college and sports activities of the college should be regularized.

3. Increase number of capacity building activities, career and counseling activities

4. Proper mechanisim for keeping the record of students placed should be formalized through Placement Cell of the college.

5. Students' progression to higher education should be increased by motivating students for HE at departmental level.

6. Every department should have an alumni association.

#### 6. Governance leadership and management:

**Observations:** Governance, leadership and management at college level is very good. The effect of the same could be seen at the departmental level. HODs of almost all departments are proactive to the quality initiatives of the college administration.

**Suggestions:** Practice of keeping record for each and every activity at department level may bring a positive impact on the data management of the college.

#### 7. Innovation and best practices:

**Observations:** During the process of academic audit some departments have presented that their extracurricular activities, viz. seminar, webinar, workshops, publishing wall magazine etc., and encouraging students to participate therein to bring out the best within students as their best practices. Some other departments have highlighted some practices in teaching learning, viz. use of virtual lab for practical, use of e-books, hands on training in laboratory, class tests, and maintenance of course completion reports etc. as their best practices.

**Suggestions:** 1. Departments must consider on doing something unique beyond the regular teaching learning and extracurricular activities as their best practice.

#### 4. Strength, Weakness, Opportunities/ Challenges:

Strength: 1.Committed faculty members with commitment to develop quality teaching.2. ICT enabled infrastructures.

**Weakness:** 1. Less number of class rooms. 2. Inadequate number of teachers in every department. 3. No skill enhancement courses for students. Poor research culture.

**Opportunities:** 1. Enough scope for optimizing the use of ICT in teaching and learning. 2. Enough scope for producing university rank holders.

Challenges: 1. Placement for passed out students, and maintaining record for the same.2. Optimizing the rate of students' progression to higher education.

#### INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR ON "REDEFINING LANGUAGE IN THE MODERN DIGITAL ERA"


The Department of English in collaboration with IQAC, Ambedkar College had organized an International Webinar on 1st July, 2021 from 9am onwards on the topic "Redefining Language in the Modern Digital Era" and a total no. of 416 participants had registered for the Webinar from all over the country. The program was inaugurated by Honorable Prof. Arunaday Saha, Former Vice-Chancellor, Tripura University and Chairman State Council for Higher Education, Govt. Of Tripura and the organizing secretary Ms Jacinta Zirsangzeli Darlong presented welcome address to all the participants. The webinar was addressed by eminent scholars and academicians; Prof. Indranil Acharya of Vidvasagar University.Midnapur West Bengal, Associate Prof. Dr.Miazi Hazam of Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh. Assistant Prof. Dr. Anita Chaudhuri of University of British Columbia, Canada and Assistant Prof. Dr.Ziuziu of Fazl Ali College, Iheilung




Nagaland. The resource persons took up the topic of discussion from various aspects of learning by using their experiences and critical reflections on the issue.


Prof. Indranil Acharya discussed the importance of the language as a reflection that envelops time and space throughout the centuries. He explores language as a medium to articulate ideas of the human mind. He elaborately explained about scientific propositions in human language, evolving human brain and change of language indicating the structure of language different from human brain, new approach of thinking by human brain resulting a shift in conventional use of the language and man's cognitive processes, the danger of natural languages along with the emergence of the new technological language. He also dealt on Post Human phase of evolution, image based system of communication and the threats from machine languages using Artificial Intelligence. He concludes his lecture by mentioning some linguistic lab's published list of "Digitally Dead Languages" with 98% Indian languages in the list.





Associate Prof. Dr.Miazi Hazam at the very outset dwelt upon his views or his perception of the digital influence on the language. He elaborately discussed about the threat or crisis of losing the grip on language in a world where digital technology was beginning to take over as a help for improving language in the form of apps and tech-aids especially in this time of the Pandemic where all activities are shifted to online mode. He further illustrated the three revolutions in language: From the Invention of the Printing Press to Shakespeare's use of and contribution to the English language unto the Digital Influence on language. Further he explained in detail about the confusion over Digital Humanities and what led to the entry of digital technologies in the field of education and the differences between Written and Spoken Language. Through his lecture Dr.Hazam clearly highlighted that the intervention of digitalization in the field of learning has helped in wide dissemination of knowledge by liberating it beyond the confines of the four walls of traditional classrooms and democratized language but at the same time concluded on the fact that being too dependent on technology can make individual lose their inborn ability or skills and agreed to the fact that no amount of technology will be helpful enough without the agency of human teachers.





Assistant Professor Dr. Anita Chaudhuri discussed about the numerous online learning mode, formats and resources digital technology has to offer. She began her lecture highlighting the various platform for online composition practices , multimodal composition and the pedagogical shifts on open educational resources and re-mediation of disciplinary knowledge. She further talked about the flexibility in the teaching-learning and assessment process the digital technology has made and the rhetorical strategy for text development before shifting her focus on the negative aspects or the challenges that the students in digital era faces such as maintaining of study habits, the digital divide, learning curve and the quick turnaround for new assessment practices. Her lecture provided an insight to the immediate need of balancing the use of technology for learning process and the need to draw a line from the threat of misusing these technologies.

Assistant Professor Dr. ZiuZiu Iheilung talked about how the digital revolution has transformed language triggering an explosion of new vocabulary, genre and styles etc. She has observed that in the last 10 years or so there had been a drastic change in language teaching and learning focusing more on the language skills, vocabulary, grammar, critical thinking skills and imaginative skills. Dr.Iheilung discussed about the history of language teaching and learning (Methods) and the various teaching methods which will help



learners to distinguish between the formal and informal usages of the language. Digital technology has undoubtedly aided the teaching learning process as a tool for instructions but at the same time has resulted in deteriorating student's competence of reading, writing and speaking. She concludes her lectures by suggesting methods teachers may adopt in order to keep the balance of both the positive and negatives usage of digital technologies.

Towards the end of the lecture session, the resource persons lucidly clarified and answered queries posted by the participants in the chat box. With a positive feedback from the participants, the Webinar concluded with the Presidential address made by Dr.Subrata Sharma, Principal In-charge Ambedkar College.



In the inaugural session, speech from Chief Patron of the webinar sir Sri N.C Sharma, Director, Higher Education, Govt. of Tripura and from the chairman of the organizing Committee Dr. Udai Narayan Adhikary, Principal In-charge, K.N Mahavidyalaya were very inspiring for all of us, as they have reflected several issues related to our water resources in connection with Covid-19 pandemic and the importance of organizing a national level webinar on such a beautiful and relevant topic. Sir N.C Sharma in his informative speech has highlighted several key issues related to the impact of the covid-19 pandemic on our water resources in the national level scenario.




The webinar was addressed by eminent academicians; Prof. (Dr.) Pankaj Kumar Roy, Dean of Jadavpur University and Professor and Joint Director of the Department of School of Water Resources Engineering, Jadavpur University (JU), Dr. Sushant Kumar Biswal, Assistant professor, Dept. of Civil Engineering, NIT, Agartala, Dr. Malabika Biswas Roy, Assistant Professor and Head of the Department of Geography, Women's College Calcutta and Dr. Dipanwita Nag, Medical Officer, ONGC, Tripura Asset.



The resource persons took up the topic of discussion from various aspects of learning by using their views, experiences, and critical reflections on such a vital issue of water resources. Prof. Pankaj Kumar Roy discussed on impact of the Covid-19 Pandemic on our Water, Environment, and Related Ecological system. In his speech he has highlighted on pollution of the Ganga river pollution in West- Bengal and also the Howrah River in Tripura, due to surface runoff of wastewater. He has commented on the increased demand for freshwater from the Indian perspective , with the urban population growth. He has highlighted the roles of the Central Pollution Control Board for the supply of freshwater under quality-controlled conditions throughout entire India and also explained how this activity has become a challenging task for the board in this Covid-19 pandemic situation. He has an expectation that as the COVID-19 period has stopped all the major industrial sources of pollution that affect aquatic systems, Industrial wastewater, crude oil, heavy metals, and plastic disposal into the river have completely stopped. So it is expected that several major Indian rivers including Ganga will be more and cleaner due to second wave lockdown. He has explained very nicely how the different sectors in India including agriculture are being affected directly or indirectly due to the impact of the covid-19 pandemic on our water resources. He also discussed different observable changes of the Covid-19 lockdown on our Ecology and Environment.




Dr. Sushant Kumar Biswal discussed how the Covid-19 pandemic is affecting the irrigation and agricultural sectors of India. He has commented that the agriculture sector is facing serious challenges due to this pandemic through disruption in the provision of irrigation and agriculture



services by affecting food consumption, production, and distribution. According to him, the Covid-19 situations in rural districts of agricultural states are deteriorating more substantially. He has demonstrated very nicely through the slide show, how the agricultural value is being affected by covid-19 throughout the entire nation. The crop cycle in India has two main seasons-Rabi and Kharif and according to him, both the cycles are severely affected by the lockdown driven by the pandemic. He has also shown how the agriculture sector, in different regions of India, is highly affected due to the impact on production and marketing of related materials in this covid-19 pandemic period. According to him, India must insist on innovative solutions and new policies to ensure that if India emerges in any economic crisis due to the covid-19 issue then it should not only aware of the countries' weakness but also primed to effect the necessary changes.



Dr. Malabika Biswas Roy in her lecture mainly showed how the covid-19 pandemic is affecting our environment and water bodies and related socioeconomic system. In her lecture, she has highlighted the general concept of covid-19 & its outbreak, the impact of covid-19 on the water sector, analysis of the impact of Covid-19 on environmental aspects, and finally the impact of Covid-19 on the socio-economic sector. She showed that as an outcome of several studies this has been found that Water consumption during this Covid-19 pandemic, basically in relation to household works, hand washing, etc. have been increased by 17%. She has highlighted the issue of severe losses on pisciculture in west-Bengal; due to the combined effect of lockdown and cyclones. She also commented in her lecture that the future water demand, mainly for domestic consumption, would be based on how a majority of the population prefer to work in post-Covid -19 periods as there is evidence for increased demand for packaged and or bottled water consumption in global cities. Finally, she has discussed on overall impacts of Covid-19 on the socio-economic scenario.



Dr. Dipanwita Nag talked about different water-borne diseases and discussed the fact that whether Covid-19 is water borne? She has mentioned in her lecture that according to the WHO, water-borne diseases account for an estimated 4.1% of the total daily global burden of disease, and cause about 1.8 million human deaths annually. She has discussed several water-borne diseases and their causes, symptoms, effects, clinical diagnosis, and treatment guidelines. She has shown in various slides that how different pathogens present in water and wastewater are responsible for potential risks to public health. Finally, she has highlighted the issue that whether Covid-19 is waterborne? In this section, she also highlighted the structure of corona virus and show documentary clips about how this virus spreads from person to person to develop a pandemic. In her lecture, this has been explored that SARS-CoV is stable in feces at room temperature for a minimum of 1-2 days and can survive for up to 4 days in stool from diarrheal patients. According to her lecture, SARS-CoV-2 has already been detected in feces raising the possibility of fecal-oral transmission especially during flushing which can aerosolize fecal matter, resulting in airborne transmission and such probability of transmission is high in hospital and quarantine centers settings where toilets are shared. She also commented that corona viruses can survive up to 2–3 days in sewage water and up to 10 days in tap water at 23 °C; however, temperature, organic matter levels, and presence of antagonistic bacteria and oxidants such as chlorine are also the factors for its survival in water. Finally, she concluded that the persistence of the virus in water and sewage is yet to be investigated more before declaring it as waterborne.



Towards the end of the lecture session, the resource persons lucidly clarified and answered queries posted by the participants in the chat box. With positive feedback from the participants, the Webinar concluded with the Presidential address made by Dr. Subrata Sharma, Principal In-charge Ambedkar College. Finally the feedback forms collected from the participants explored that the objective of the webinar was achieved as the overall session discussion benefitted the faculties and research scholars.






Figure 4: Deliberation of Dr. Jayaditha Purkhayastha on herpeto fauna of NE India.




Figure 1: Flyer of the International E-conference: "Application of nanotechnology in the field of biology"




Figure2: Deliberation of prof. Jogen Chandra Kalita, Gauhati University




Figure 4: Deliberation of Dr. Jayaditha Purkhayastha on herpeto fauna of NE India.






Figure1: Deliberation of Mr. Dhaval Bhatt, Gyanmanjuri Science College Gujrat.



Chemical Exfoliation, Thermal Exfoliation, Liquid Exfoliation, Modifications to improve efficiency, optoelectronic properties, doping in constructing heterojunctions, coupling with Carbonaceous Materials, Fabrication of Nanostructured NIO/WO3 with graphite Carbon Nitride for visible light driven photocatalytic hydroxylation of benzene and metronidazole degradation, Trans Esterification of Soyabean Oil, Synergic Effect of Metal Complex and dual Doped Graphite Carbon Nitride for Superior photo-catalytic Hydrogen Evolution etc.







The response of the Participants: The participants enthusiastically participated and showcased their brilliance. Though some of the questions were very tricky,



**Observations:** The participation in online quiz showed that the students really like this platform (Google Quiz form) in which they can take part hassle free. It was low costing, time saving and more accurate.



# REPORT National Level Online Quiz Competition on Olympics Organized by Carrere and Counseling Cell, Ambedkar College, Tripura



# Chart showing students participated from two different states, Tripura and Odisha, and their percentage




Chart showing average score of participants










#### **Voluntary Blood Donation Camps**
